
COMPASS STUDY

RMD's & QCD's

Some of you have annuities and retirement accounts, that if you are over the age of 73, you know that by year end you need to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from that account or pay a penalty. But did you know that there is a way you can exclude all or a portion of your RMD from income and not have to pay taxes on it. You take a Qualified Charitable Deduction from your account and it is not income and thus not directly from your account to the charity you designate and not to you. St. Mark Lutheran Church would be a qualified charity for your gift. By taking a Qualified Charitable Deduction (QC)D) you can meet the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) guidelines. To take a QCD, contact the manager of your annuity or retirement account and ask them to make the gift to the charity or church of your choosing. If you have any questions or concerns, you can speak to Pastor Paul.
