Stewardship Information

Contribution Envelopes: Just a brief explanation for the various line items on our contribution envelopes. **General Fund** = This amount is used to pay all the operating bills for our church, i.e., water, gas, electric, etc. **Long Range** = The amount is used to pay the monthly building loan of \$759.84 each month. This loan is from the 2015 building addition of our beautiful narthex. Original amount of the loan was \$125,000. Current loan balance is at \$63,000. 2024 new loan rate has risen to 5.125%. Additional funds that are over the amount used to pay the monthly balance is occasionally sent to LCEF to pay off on principal. Missions = This is used for the quarterly mission projects that are showcased by Lani Murray in the narthex each quarter. If you do not designate any amount on the outside of the envelope your funds are applied to the General Fund line. Automatic payment withdrawal from your bank account; forms are available



from the church office.

A Lenten Challenge

Many people talk about giving up something for Lent. It may be something as simple as eating chocolate or stopping at Starbucks. It is supposed to remind them of the sacrifice that Jesus made to save us from an eternity in hell. However their sacrifice pales in comparison to all that Jesus did and after Lent they soon return to their former habits.

This Lenten season, I would like to challenge you to do something that benefits us at St. Mark and also is a reminder to you that Jesus has purchased and won you from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and His innocent suffering and death, as Luther so beautifully stated it. The interest rate on our Building Loan has just gone up 1% and our current balance is around \$63,000. Lent is only 40 days long as we do not count the Sundays in Lent. On each of the 40 days of Lent as part of your daily devotions or prayers, I challenge you to set aside a \$ 1 or \$ 2 or any other \$ amount of your choosing as a special offering to be given at the end of Lent toward the Building Loan. Maybe place it in a jar marked My Offering. As you watch your daily offerings grow it can remind you of the greater price Jesus was willing to pay for your ransom. Then at the end of Lent as we all bring our Special Offerings, let us see how

God has blessed us and how much we can reduce our loan when we share together.
