

# **25 Members Attended**

Nate Kershner called the meeting to order at 10:10 am and Pastor Paul opened with prayer. Minutes from the January meeting was distributed, and a motion was made by Tom W. and seconded by Tom Murray to accept the minutes, Motion approved. Financial Report: Holly reported the following balances: Accounts Payable \$5,629.65 General Fund \$41,935.21 Leaf /Goals \$7,549.70 and LCEF \$8,118.37, Sound System will be paid out of Gift & Memorial Fund. St. John will send \$25,000 as per the agreement with us and it will probably be forwarded in quarterly increments. Pastor Polzin has purchased furniture and bookcases in the amount of \$1266 dollars. Reverend Joseph Polzin will be the speaker at Pastor Polzin's installation service, and he will be paid \$200. The motion was made by Tom and seconded by Tricia.

#### **New Chalice**

On April 17, Maundy or Holy Thursday, we dedicated a chalice or common cup for use in the distribution of the wine of the Lord's Supper. The chalice is a farewell gift from Pastor Paul and Cindy. The addition of the chalice adds a new wrinkle to the communion distribution but should not make it take any longer. Distribution procedure for now is much the same as before. Pastor will distribute the bread, the elder will follow with the tray of individual cups, and then pastor with the chalice will follow the elder. If you consume the wine with an individual cup, would you please hold it in your hand as pastor comes with the common cup so that he knows you do not want the wine from the chalice. If you prefer to use the chalice, feel free to assist pastor by tilting the base of the cup to receive the wine.
